**All Saints Day, Friday, November 1:** the day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. The feast of All Saints should inspire us with tremendous hope. We are all called to be saints. For this we pray through the intercession of the saints.

**All Souls Day, Saturday, November 2:** the day is a commemoration of all the faithful departed, those baptized Christians who are believed to be in purgatory. We pray for their joyful reunion with their loving creator.

**CWL Memorial Mass, 6:00, Wednesday, November 6:** members are encouraged to attend, taking the time to remember all our League sisters who have gone before us. Let us once again hear their names echoed in our church where they once knelt in prayer. **Note:** Refreshments will be served in the church hall following the mass.

**CWL General Meeting, Wednesday, November 6:** the meeting will take place following the gathering after the memorial mass.

**Remembrance Day, Monday, November 11:** the Royal Canadian Legion conducts the Poppy Campaign to raise funds in support of veterans and their families. We wear poppies in remembrance. We pray for all those who have served or are serving our country in the armed services - for those who died or were wounded and for veterans. We pray for peace.

**World Day of the Poor, Sunday, November 17:** in his message for this day, Pope Francis quoted, "*The prayer of the poor rises up to God.*" (cf. Sir 21:5) In preparation for the Jubilee Year, he calls us to prayer, to become *pilgrims of hope* - to find ways to reach out to the poor, to pray for peace.
